JOB SUMMARY

Kwilmu'kw Maw-klusuaqn Negotiation Office (KMK) supports the Assembly of Nova Scotia Mi'kmaw Chiefs (Assembly) in the negotiation and consultation processes. KMK engages Nova Scotia Mi'kmaw communities on the best ways to implement our collective Aboriginal and Treaty Rights. KMK is seeking a **Policy Analyst** to support the Maw-Kleyukik Knijannaq/Child and Family Initiative (MKK) in this important work.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILTIES

Reporting to the MKK Project Lead, **the Policy Analyst** will be accountable for providing information, policy advice and analysis, and strategic advice to the Assembly and senior management of KMK on a range of cultural and governance issues for the Mi'kmaw of Nova Scotia.

Further, the Policy Analyst will focus on the development of culturally-relevant policies, programs and materials. This role will collaborate with other internal departments, other levels of government, agencies and Mi'kmaw communities.

- Post-secondary degree in political science, public policy, public administration, law, or related
- Minimum of two (2) years experience in policy analysis
- Strong understanding and familiarity with Mi'kmaw communities
- Excellent, and demonstrated, research and analytical skills
- Strong organizational skills and attention to detail
- Possesses strong tact, diplomacy, and interpersonal skills
- Exceptional written and verbal communication skills
- Ability to work efficiently individually and as part of a team
- Prior experience working with Mi'kmaw and/or Aboriginal communities and organizations is an asset
